

The morning dew armchair from brühl rests on either a circular swivel base or four slender legs, and the straight central element of the armchair's backrest features an ornamental, stylised flower design. The backrest's petal-inspired, overlapping sections invite you to recline and relax, while the chaise longue offers you even more relaxation for one or two people. Milan Furniture Fair

The elegant, organic, leaf-like segments of lemon by brühl form a silhouette that resembles a blooming flower bud. The armchair fans out into five elongated leaf-shaped sections that taper towards the top, giving the piece a crown-like contour. The deep, softly upholstered seat, the alternating convex or concave elements, and the slightly cupped shape of the leaf segments mould themselves to the body to provide maximum relaxation and comfort. The base and seat/backrest can be covered in the same colour elastic stretch wool fabric, cotton or leather, or in different colours.
